Combating COVID-19: Street Children International's Efforts to Support Students During the Pandemic Jonaki Singh

The year 2020 was difficult and challenging in many respects, as the COVID-19 pandemic impacted almost all aspects of our lives. However, this difficult year proved that when we as a community come together, we can rise above any challenges we face. During 2020, several of our supported schools reached out to us and requested additional assistance in order to help their students through the dual challenges of COVID-19 and the Amphan Cyclone, which struck West Bengal in the summer of 2020. With the support of our members and donors, Street Children International held a successful COVID-19 fundraiser in June 2020 and provided additional grants to these schools. In so doing, Street Children International ensured that our supported students and their families remained safe and healthy during this difficult time. Here are just a few examples of how SCI's support benefitted our supported schools and students.

Hijaldiha Seva Samity in Hijaldiha, West Bengal, offers free education and meals to destitute children. An additional grant from Street Children International in the summer of 2020 enabled Hijaldiha Seva Samity to distribute masks and hand sanitizer to the students and their families in order to minimize infections and combat the spread of the virus.





Similarly, Mass Welfare Society's Little Flower School offers free education to children in the rural area of Dhamua, West Bengal. An additional grant from Street Children International in the summer of 2020 enabled Mass Welfare Society to distribute staple food items (such as rice, potatoes, onions, and cooking oil) to the students and their families, many of whom were rendered unemployed due to the impact of the pandemic and the Amphan cyclone. This support ensured that students and their families continued to have their basic needs met during this extremely challenging time.

Sarada Kalyan Bhandar provides educational activities, health care, and nutrition to children from rural communities. Children receive remedial coaching, study materials, clothing, nutritious refreshments. Classes on computer skills, spoken English, drawing, painting, music, sports, and yoga are conducted as a part of the daily routine that supports the mission of nurturing the underprivileged children. Doctors take care of community's needs in a systematic and planned manner. SCI's support and guidance enables MANTRA to sustain its vision and growth in addressing children's needs.

Anil Chandra was one of the founding members of Street Children International. During his term as a treasurer, president, and a member of the Board of Trustees, he dedicated his time and effort in the service of providing education and nutrition for destitute children supported by this charitable organization. The members of the community will miss his kind presence and guidance.

As a life member of Cultural Association of Bengal and a recipient of the 2001 CAB annual award, Anil Chandra was a strong pillar of the NYC Bengali community. He passed away on January 21, 2021 at the age of 84 years. He was a CPA by profession and immigrated to USA in December 1970. He led a fulfilling life.

Surviving is his wife of 54 years, Bharati (Manju), daughter Srabani, son Subhasish, son-in-law Ishan, daughter-in law Monica, and four grandchildren.








